

SAVE THE DATE

August 27-28

Rebekah Simon-Peter is coming to Ponca City First United Methodist Church to work with the congregation to help Deepen Your Faith and Bring the Impossible to Life. Through her seminars she helps transform church leaders and their congregations

"Our mainstream congregations are in trouble," says Rebekah Simon-Peter, author of DREAM LIKE JESUS: Deepen Your Faith and Bring the Impossible to Life

Simon-Peter wants to show Protestant congregations how they can imbue new life in their church if they would only embrace the empowerment that is their Christian heritage.

Her handbook teaches clergy and lay leaders how to recapture the vision that is at the core of Christian belief, the new, empowering conversations that Jesus inspired through sharing visions that had never been uttered before. Rather than the nice, safe, predictable Jesus of mainstream religion, Simon-Peter shows how the rabble rouser of the New Testament can inspire congregations to dream big dreams and develop big, bold visions where the church is the agent of the vision, rather than the recipient.

To get started, Simon-Peter identifies the eight symptoms of a church without vision, which

include:

- **Shrinking numbers**: The first warning sign of a church in decline.
- **Problem people**: Conflict increases as the pool of resources decreases.
- Stagnant giving: If you don't lead with vision, people won't be inspired to give.
- **Listless worship**: Without vision, worship is like throwing a party where the guest of honor never shows up.
- Gutless prayer: Pastoral prayer reveals which churches are playing it safe, and which are playing full out.
- Bait-and-switch evangelism: Young people are looking for a vibrant community of faith, not a poorly disguised attempt to increase donations.
- Insulated focus: A congregation that isn't an integral part of the life of the community.
- Dead-end decision making: When caution elbows faith out of the driver's seat, nothing gets accomplished.

To address these problems, Simon Peter introduces the DARE model dreaming like Jesus—

- Dream (like Jesus),
- Align (others to your dream),
- Realize (the dream) and
- Expand (the dream).

She encourages congregations to dream big and own their spiritual authority. To understand their role as a partner in creation of a better world, a world where anyone can reclaim Jesus's power to dream and co-create miracles. A world where new and better realities are brought

into being. And the time to start is now.

Cost of the seminar to members of the church will be \$50. The cost will include lunch on Saturday and snacks. A potluck dinner is being planned following church on Sunday. We hope you will join us and be a part of transforming and revitalizing our congregation.




If you answered John Wesley on all of the questions, you would be correct.

HISTORY HIGHLIGHT #3

Did you know....

The years of 1940 to 1960 began with World War II which made the operation of First Methodist Church difficult. Rev. Phil Drescher was the pastor. In addition to his regular duties, Dr. Drescher performed a commendable service by conducting religious services at the Prisoner of War Camp north of Tonkawa by addressing the prisoners in their native tongue of German. There were 52 young men from the Ponca City area who served in the war with 6 of them losing their lives.

In the fall of 1944, the church celebrated its 50th anniversary. The operating budget of the church was set at \$8000 and included an increase of the pastor's salary to \$1200. Rev. Drescher saw potential for growth in the downtown church, but instead recommended that other locations be opened elsewhere in the city.

One of the most important additions to the church during the first 50 years was the music department. The choir had been organized in 1903 and originally had only 4 members. Youth choirs were added in 1935. By the time of the 50th celebration in 1944, the number of church

choirs had increased to 7: adult, senior high, junior high, junior girls, primary, beginners and boys. For many years, the church also had a Sunday School orchestra, but war conditions terminated its existence.

In 1948, due to the over-crowed Sunday School classrooms, the church thought it necessary to purchase land to build a new Religious Education Building. The lot at 208 S. 6th St. next door to the church was not available for sale, but the adjoining lot at 210 6th St. was. The church acquired the 210 property, only later to then acquire the 208 lot. By 1950 the RE building was ready for occupancy.

The minister's salary had grown to \$5400 and the total budget of the church had risen to \$24,208.

The original parsonage at 211 S. 5th St. was in poor condition and was not inadequate for the pastor and family anymore. The Board of Trustees decided to purchase a new property at 309. N. 10th St. for a sum of \$19,500.

In 1952 a smaller chapel was added to the northwest room beside the sanctuary. This was done through a donation by the Parker family. The Parker Memorial Chapel would serve the church by holding small weddings and Sunday School classes until the present day. In 1954 airconditioning was added to all the church buildings. Parking had become a problem for the growing church. Several lots across the street to the east were purchased in 1956 to create more space for cars and buses.

In 1959 a living memorial was given by the Yeary family to purchase handbells for the church choir. The bells were cast by the Whitechapel Bell Foundry in London, England. This same company cast the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia.

First Church was now sending missionaries around the world to countries such as the Belgian Congo. By 1962 the church had become quite active in Ponca City, so a new position for an associate pastor was created with a salary of \$4200. In 1964 the pastor's salary was raised to \$9500 and the budget had grown substantially to a whopping \$100,287.
