The story of the woman at the well (John 4) tells of a fascinating encounter between a woman who has come to a well to draw water at noon and Jesus is reclining there waiting for his disciples to return from fetching food from nearby community. Jesus asks the woman for a drink of water. The woman, a Samaritan, is shocked that Jesus would speak to her because of her race and sex. Jesus shares with her about living water. (I'm trusting you know the story well enough, or you will go and read it again for yourself.) The disciples returned and are amazed Jesus is speaking to this woman.

*The woman left her water jar beside the well and ran back to the village, telling everyone, "Come and see a man who told me everything I ever did! Could he possibly be the Messiah?" So the people came streaming from the village to see him.*

**John 4: 28 - 30**

I wish to focus on these three verses as we are told of the excitement and exuberance of the woman toward Jesus. She had to tell everyone!

When my son Jeremy was in the

5<sup>th</sup> grade, I went to meet with his teacher. She was a member of a non-denominational church outside of the town that formed when the local Baptist church split. Many of the older generation did not care for the young dynamic pastor with all the new ideas and decided to make a change. Many progressive/younger families left with the scorned pastor to form this new church and it had taken off prior to our arrival. This new congregation was averaging hundreds more than anyone else in the community. That day she was wearing a shirt that featured her church. In our discussion, I mentioned I was pastor of the United Methodist Church in town. To my surprise, she spent a great deal of time talking up her church and trying to recruit my family to worship there... and I was pastor of another church in the same community! That was either very gutsy or she was so excited about what God was doing in their church and could not help but share it. She was like the woman at the well, she could not help but tell everyone what she had discovered.

Have you ever taken time to sit around people who attend other churches and listen to what they have to say about their church home? How often are their words positive and filled with excitement? Most of the times I hear comments about churches, it tends to be people complaining about something. The critique often is on elements of the church that fails to meet their standard. The music is too loud...or not loud enough. The temperature is too hot...or too cold. The kids in the church move around too much...or there are no kids in the church and that's bad. The preacher talks too long...or he/she doesn't preach long enough. We tend to want to talk about the

things that are lacking and are often directed at the humans in charge. Think back to the woman at the well, she was excited and was telling the amazing contact she had had with Jesus. I'm sure there were many things at the non-denominational church Jeremy's teacher was promoting, but all I was being told about was the amazing things that were happening.

It is amazing what God can do when He works through excited Christians. If you and I were so motivated, like the woman at the well, what do you think would happen in our own church family? If each of us started looking for the awesome things God was doing in our lives and began sharing that with others, how contagious do you think the faith would become? I must admit, I'm not attracted to negative places. Are you? We had the prayer walk on August 28<sup>th</sup>; how do you think God will use that? We had our Round-up event, how do you think God could use that to reach and excite those in our church and community? We have a brand-new pavilion that will soon be completed. How do you think God can use that to make a difference in our church and in our city? Other ministry events are being planned that will transform our church and community, if we only believe and are on fire for Jesus. I want the best for our church. I pray you do, too. I pray you will become our version of the woman at the well.





The United Methodist Church has Missions and Ministries in our apportionments that are often under-served in our giving. They have special giving days throughout the year

**Skyline Urban Ministry** is located in the shadow of the downtown Oklahoma City skyline, and its mission is to serve those who live in that shadow. By *Bridging the Gaps and Lighting the Shadows*, Skyline lives out its mission to impact lives by addressing the roots of poverty and empowering those in need. Skyline has been providing four areas of ministry --groceries, meals, clothing, eye care and dignity since 1974.

The focus of Skyline's service has always been the poor and needy of Oklahoma County. Nevertheless, the agency has nurtured strong relationships across our state. Skyline serves as a setting for groups to serve the working poor in Oklahoma County and as a model for others as they seek to serve the needy in their own communities.

There was a fund raising event for this ministry on July 30th but donations may be made at any time.

**Eye Clinic**--Skyline's Eye Clinic connects patrons to free basic eye exams conducted by volunteer ophthalmologists and optometrists. Additionally, Skyline's Optician Clinic allows patrons with a current prescription to select low or no cost frames.

**Food Resource Center**--The Food Resource Center is Skyline's busiest program. Operating differently from traditional pantries, the FRC offers a unique shopping experience for patrons and volunteers alike.

**Garden Program**--Skyline's Garden Program exists to provide fresh produce to their Food Resource Center. Additionally, it offers patrons the opportunity to learn more about gardening through seasonal gardening classes.


**Style Shop**--Skyline's Style Shop operates with low prices for gently used women's, men's and children's clothing, shoes and accessories. Additionally, the store provides students in need with formal wear and new school wear.

Please let the church office know if you'd like to help.




## CHILDREN'S CHURCH





## MOTHER'S DAY OUT


